CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

Has spent parts of each of the last two seasons in the majors with Cincinnati (2015) and Boston (2016)... is 2-for-30 (.067) in 26 games... has a .267 (621-for-2325) average with 46 home runs, 215 RBI and 156 stolen bases in 646 games over seven seasons in the minors... has played exclusively in the outfield, including 537 games in center field, 78 in right field and 10 in left field... played in the Arizona Fall League in 2013... was ranked by *Baseball America* as the best defensive outfielder in the Reds organization in four consecutive seasons (entering 2011-14)... in 2011, he led all High-A players with 19 outfield assists and in 2012 he led all Double-A players with 20 outfield assists in 2012.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS

Appeared in five games with Boston following his June 18th call up... pitched one inning in relief July 2 at Fenway Park against the Angels... allowed no runs and two hits... it marked his first pitching outing at any professional level... was designated for assignment by Boston July 7 and after clearing waivers, was outrighted to Triple-A July 11... spent a majority of the season with Triple-A Pawtucket, leading the PawSox in average (min. 250 AB) and stolen bases... his 41 RBI ranked second on the club... the .303 average and 10 home runs were both minor league career bests and the 17 stolen bases were his highest total since 2013 (23).

CAREER

2015—Made Major League debut with Cincinnati, appearing in 21 games and making five starts... spent the majority of the season with Triple-A Louisville, ranking among the club leaders in doubles (2nd, 17), home runs (t-3rd, 8) and stolen bases (2nd, 11)... selected to the ML roster Aug. 20 and made his debut Aug. 22 against Arizona as the starting center fielder... went 0-for-5... recorded his first ML hit Aug. 23 against Arizona, a fifth inning single off Chase Anderson... appeared in 13 games (5 starts) for the Reds in center field, two in left field and one in right field... attended spring training as a non-roster invitee with the Reds... began the season in Louisville and hit safely in 11 of his first 12 games from April 24 to May 6 (15-for-48, .313)... hit .347 and slugged .555 during a 21-game span with Louisville from July 18 to Aug. 8 (25-for-72, six doubles, three home runs)... went 4-for-4 with two doubles and a home run July 18 vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre... for the Bats, recorded five assists and two double plays in 80 games (77 starts) in center fielder... also made one appearance in right field.

2014—Was limited to 17 games with Triple-A Louisville due to three stints on the disabled list... was on the DL from April 17 to May 15 and May 28 through the remainder of the season with a stress fracture in his lower left leg and a sports hernia... on June 6 had core muscle hernia surgery... was designated for assignment Aug. 12... was released Aug. 15, but was re-signed on Aug. 19 to a minor league contract through the 2015 season.

2013—Spent the majority of season with Double-A Pensacola, leading the Blue Wahoos in runs (55), triples (tied, 4) and stolen base (22)... also ranked among the leaders in games (3rd, 126), hits (3rd, 111), doubles (t-2nd, 19), home runs (2nd, 10), total bases (2nd, 168) and walks (2nd, 44)... also appeared in three games with Triple-A Louisville... recorded 20 out field assists (all in center field), which were the most among Double-A players... was also part of three double plays... posted a .292/.362/.431 batting line after the All-Star break... was named Southern League Player of the Week on July 15... homered in three straight games from July 10 to 12... broke a 3-3 tie with a game-winning, ninth inning, two-run home run on July 10 at Montgomery... had a season-long 10-game hitting streak from Aug. 18-26 (14-

for-39, .359)... was transferred to Louisville Aug. 31 and scored a run in each of his three games with the Bats... following the season, appeared in two games for Glendale in the Arizona Fall League and went 2-for-5 (.400) with a walk and stolen base... was added to the Reds' 40-man roster Nov. 20.

2012—Spent the entire season with Double-A Pensacola... was named a Southern League mid-season All-Star... his 30 stolen bases ranked tied for fourth in the Reds organization and fifth in the Southern League... led the Blue Wahoos in games (133), runs (68), hits (127), doubles (tied, 22), total bases (170), and walks (60)... recorded a .356 on-base percentage... had an on-base percentage above .400 in May (.402) and July (.430)... had 35 multi-hit performances, including in four consecutive games from April 18-21 and July 20-24... hit .375 (18-for-48) during a season-long 11-game hitting streak from April 18 to 28... walked in all four plate appearances on July 28 against Huntsville... following the season, was ranked by *Baseball America* as the Reds' best defensive outfielder and 21st best prospect... also ranked as the best defensive outfielder and as having the best outfield arm in the Southern League.

2011—Spent the majority of the season with High-A Bakersfield, ranking among club leaders in games (2nd, 117), runs (2nd, 78), triples (t-2nd, 3), total bases (3rd, 165) and walks (2nd, 42)... also played in five games with Double-A Carolina... combined to steal 55 bases, which ranked second in the Reds organization, third in the California League and seventh among all minor leaguers... recorded 19 out-field assists with Bakersfield (16 as center fielder, three as right fielder), which were the most among all High-A players... spent time on the DL from April 26 to May 2... recorded 10-game hitting streaks from June 24 to July 3 and Aug. 5-16... was successful in all three stolen base attempts on July 12 against Stockton... transferred to Carolina Sept. 1 and stole three bases in only five games... was successful in his final 14 stolen base attempts of the year between the two clubs (beginning Aug. 11)... following the season, was ranked by *Baseball America* as the Reds' best defensive outfielder and 14th-best prospect.

2010—Made his professional debut, combining with Single-A Dayton and High-A Lynchburg to hit .276 (70-for-254) with a .361 on-base percentage and 19 stolen bases in 68 games... recorded eight assists without committing an error in 154 total chances, making 32 starts in center field and 31 in right field... went 4-for-5 with four runs and three steals on July 6 at West Michigan... hit .388 (19-for-49) during a season-high 12-game hitting streak from July 31 to Aug. 12... was promoted to Lynchburg Aug. 24... following the season, was ranked by *Baseball America* as the Reds' best defensive outfielder and 11th best prospect.

Ryan M. LaMarre was originally signed by Reds scout Brad Meador... is married, Whitney... prepped at Lumen Christi High School (MI)... played baseball, football and hockey... was on back-to-back state champion football teams... played collegiate baseball at the University of Michigan... was named to the All-Big Ten First Team in 2010 following Second Team honors in 2009... tabbed as the 2009 Bill Freehan Award winner, given to the Club's top hitter.
